Under the Sakura Science Exchange Program supported by Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST), UOEH hosted eight Master students and six faculty members from the Occupational Medicine Specialist (Postgraduate) Program, Faculty of Medicine, University of Indonesia from October 9 to 15. This is the seventh time for UOEH to implement this program.

The theme for this program was "Pioneering the Future of Occupational Health - International Training Program for Cooperation between Indonesia and Japan". In the lectures provided by UOEH faculty members in their expertise in occupational health, many questions were raised by the students during the program proved that the participants were all eager to learn from each lecture. They also visited the Nishinihon Occupational Health Center, which provided a good opportunity to compare Japanese health checkup facilities and actual operations with those in Indonesia.

The group also participated in the UOEH International Symposium 2023 on October 13 to 14 which was held after over ten years since the last time. One of them who presented the poster entitled "Chronic Kidney Disease in a Printing Worker Exposed to Organic Solvent" received the Excellent Poster Award at the end of the symposium.

We would be delighted if this program provided an opportunity to enhance our collaborations and advanced relationship between researchers, universities, and the nations.
